

The Synodality is a way of life that involves the participation of all members in the Church's mission. We shall build a Synodal Church from grass-root level. The Church seeks to discern what the Holy Spirit is asking of the Church at any given time. The Church can inspire trust and allow hope to flourish. We are missionaries of that hope in the world today. So rightly Pope Francis chose the theme for the Jubilee Year – "Pilgrims of Hope." We shall resolve to be the "Pilgrims of Hope" in this *Jubilee Year*, in this Year of Sanctity of Life and in this era of Synodality.

II. PASTORAL LETTER

YEAR OF LIFE - 2025

Dear Fathers, Brothers, Sisters and my dear people,

Thy Kingdom Come!

Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ!
"I came that they may have life and have it abundantly"
(John 10:10).

This pastoral letter is in preparation for the observance of the Year of life 2025 in our diocese. We all know as per our Pastoral Plan the next year is going to be the 'Year of Life'. Coincidently the Year 2025 is announced by Pope Francis as the Jubilee Year. I already have written a pastoral letter on the history and the importance of the Jubilee Year (Ref. *Chanda Samachar* XLVII, 5 &6, Sept-Dec, 2024, Pp. 2-4). We shall celebrate these two observances meaningfully with various activities. Here I share with you some reflections on the value and the source of life for our favorable considerations.

The basic concept about life is that God is the source of life and we are only stewards (Jer. 2:7, Dt. 11:12 & Rom. 11:36). God is the owner and source of life, and we have to respect it, sustain it and serve it. For this reason, any act such as abortion, murder, suicide, euthanasia etc. are against life and are considered sin. The Fifth Commandment – you shall not kill, is as an act against life and God, for God is the source of life.

Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches on sanctity of life as follows: "Human life is sacred because from its beginning it involves the creative action of God and it remains for ever in a special relationship with the Creator, who is its sole end. God alone is the Lord of life from its beginning until its end: no one can under any circumstance claim for himself the right directly to destroy an innocent human being" (CCC, 2258). So, every human life in whatever condition deserve respect. Everyone is bound to protect human life and each has the right to defend one's own life.

With regard to abortion the Church teaches us that it is the question of helplessness of a human person, who is ever denied his right to defend one's own life. "The inalienable rights of the person must be recognized and respected by civil society and the political authority. These human rights depend neither on single individual nor on parents; nor do they represent a concession made by society and the State; they belong to human nature and are inherent in the person by virtue of the creative act from which the person took his origin. Among such fundamental rights one should mention in this regard every human being's right to life and physical integrity from the moment of conception until death" (CCC, 2273).

The Fifth Commandment – "You shall not kill" (Ex 23:7, Mt 5:21) categorically prohibits any termination of human life in whatever way. It is one of the basic propositions of Holy Bible. Unequally in the created order, it is human life which is specially protected in the Bible. The fundamental prohibition on killing, and the basis for it, is set out in Genesis 9:6 "Whoever sheds the blood of a human, by a human, shall that person's blood be shed; for in his own image God made humankind" (Gen. 1:27). Life and physical health are precious gifts entrusted to us by God. We must take reasonable care of them, taking into account the needs of others and the common good. Every human life from the moment of conception until death is saved because the human person has been willed for its own sake in the image and likeness of the living and Holy God (CCC, 2319).

The Church's teaching on sanctity of life is that human life is saved from the moment of conception until natural death. The Church believes that everyone has the right to life that shall be protected and valued at every stage. Human beings are created by God in God's image (Gen. 1:27). Pope St. John Paul II has the following to say to state the incomparable worth of human person: "Man is called to fullness of life which far exceeds the dominions of his earthly existence, because it consists in sharing the very life of God" (Evangelium Vitae, 2). Recalling the 25

years of *Evangelium Vitae* Pope Francis said in his message at General Audience (25 March 2020): "Respect, defend, love and serve life, every life, every human life! It is only on this path that you will find justice, development, freedom, peace and happiness". Pope Paul VI in *Humanae Vitae* (25 July 1968) teaches that "God is the source of life", for he said; "transmission of human life is a most serious role in which married people collaborate freely and responsibly with God the creator" (# 9). In the encyclical he affirmed the teachings of the Church regarding married love, responsible parenthood, and the rejection of artificial contraception.

Life is God's gift and it is given gratuitously. God commanded not to take away life but also not to hinder or obstruct the way flow of life. God wishes that we respect all forms of life – human, animal and vegetation. Injury, obstruction of life, and taking away of any form of life, goes against God's commandment – you shall not kill. In the Year of life that we observe in 2025 we shall develop an orientation for 'prolife' and resolve to respect and protect life. God bless everyone.

Use of "MY FAMILY PRAYER"

To, All Fathers, Brothers, Sisters and people, Diocese of Chanda

Dear Fathers, Brothers, Sisters, and my dear people,

Thy Kingdom Come! Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ!

"My Family Prayer" book was prepared in the Jubilee year (2022) as part of our Catechetical and Faith Renewal program in the diocese in tune with the Pastoral Plan 2019-2033. It is now ready in three languages: English, Marathi and Hindi. The English version was released in the Jubilee year itself. The Marathi and Hindi versions were released on Chanda Family Day on 12 October 2024. It should reach every family in the diocese depending upon their preference in language. Copies are available in CLC. Kindly contact Fr. Vivek Puthenpurayil for required copies.

'My Family Prayer' (माझी कौटुंबिक प्रार्थना & मेरे परिवार की प्रार्थना) is a prayer book for daily 'family rosary' in families. It is a small booklet and very user friendly. It contains holy rosary along with special daily devotions for seven days a week. Please instruct people how to use the prayer book for daily rosary. It is briefly explained in the beginning of the prayer book itself in respective languages. After the recitation of holy rosary they shall avail the special prayers for each day from Sunday to Saturday. A reading of a short bible passage on daily basis is highly exhorted. There are also other prayers that people can use at home for their spiritual nourishment and communion. *Pesaha* meal blessing,

prayer at childbirth, prayer for birthday celebration, prayer during harvest season, prayer for domestic animals, prayer at death bed, prayer for the sick, prayer before starting of house construction, A family prayer at ordination etc are some of them. The other additions in the prayer book are litary to the Holy Eucharist, litany of humility, litany of all saints, consecration to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, Act of consecration to Mary Immaculate, prayer for peace etc. A few hymns to Blessed Virgin Mary in different languages are also given at the end. May I request everyone to explain to the people how to use the prayer book and encourage them to use it for family prayer daily. Please make sure that it reaches every family in the parishes. It may be good that people start using it from 1 January 2025 in the holy year. As you know, this prayer book is meant to develop a culture of 'family prayer' in every family. May this be an opportunity to start the practice/continue the practice of daily family prayer with more earnestness and enthusiasm. May I request everyone to do the needful to accomplish the purpose it intended. Thank you very much for your co-operation.

Dear Fathers, Brothers, Sisters,

Thy Kingdom Come! Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ!

The few things enumerated below need our attention as required. May I request everyone of you to keep these in our minds as we meet with people individually or in groups in our parishes and institutions. They are important to keep our fold together and for our peoples' well-being in the society. It shall help them for their family welfare, happy community living and social harmony. I consider that it is very important to do the needful.

- 1) Try to do more home mission, family visits, village Qurbana, seminars, retreats etc so as to help our people to grow in Christian faith and catholic culture. The conduct of Jeevotsav Retreat will serve this purpose. We shall sincerely co-operate with Jeevotsav in the diocese.
- 2) Give our children in the boardings/parishes a proper character and faith formation. Give orientation to them for a realistic target in life. We shall take interest in regular formative interactions with our boarders. It is always safe for boys, even little kids to have separate accommodation from girls, particularly for night stay.
- 3) Develop a system in parishes to keep up family morality and harmony in families. It is learned from home mission connected with Jeevotsav Retreat that we need to help our

families for marriage rectifications. Kindly bring them to the notice of the concerned.

- 4) Do what is needful to bring our people back to faith and to Church. We all know that some have gone away from our fold. We shall 'Reach' to them before we 'Preach' from the pulpit.
- 5) Start new strategies in evangelization and new contacts wherever possible for it is our primary mission. Avail social media in the best way possible.
- 6) Life-witness is of utmost importance in our mission. We shall do our best to do it well.
- 7) Sunday preaching plays key role in our missionary endeavors. Deliver prepared homilies contextual as well as touching the people's life.
- 8) Be available to the people not only for sacraments but also for other necessities of life as required. Respond effectively to the various needs of the people so as to uplift them for their social welfare. Avail every opportunity for the same from our social service centers.
- 9) Visit the sick and the elderly in parishes periodically and regularly, and console them and render them assistance as required.
- 10) Create awareness about the sanctity of life among our people. We shall very clearly communicate the teachings of the Church on 'life' as gratuitous gift of God. Proper Catechism on Abortion, Euthanasia, Suicide, Murder etc. is the need of the hour. We shall focus on these in the Year of Life 2025.
- 11) Make our liturgical celebrations active and participative so as to evolve God-experience and community feeling to witness Christian faith.
- 12) In the Church the Religious and the people who wish to have daily Holy Qurbana is to be respected. It is for this

reason Vatican Council II highly encouraged celebration of holy Qurbana daily by every Priest. Kindly do alternative arrangements on occasions when we are absent from parishes for any necessity. As required it may be good to inform a responsible person in the parish (Sisters/Catechists) about our leave of absence so as to meet with any urgency in the missions.

- 13) Each one may apply proper discretion in taking leave of absence from the parish/diocese.
- 14) Be free from any type of addiction that causes or endangers our vocation, mission and ministry.
- 15) Adequate attention is required with regard to our 'closeness' with people of different sex and minors. Be aware of the Safe Environment Policy of the Church/diocese in work places.
- 16) Our prayer life makes us genuine missionaries. The Divine Praises (*Yama Prarthanakal*), holy *Qurbana*, Confession, Recollection, Retreat, Personal prayer, Bible reading, Spiritual reading, Spiritual direction, Daily meditation, Holy hour etc. add charm to our spiritual life. We shall not show sluggish attitude in these spiritual exercises.
- 17) It is very important to develop a culture of using social media which is not befitting to our status as men and women of prayer. Refrain from the use of cell phone during celebration of sacraments particularly in the confessional.
- 18) Mutual consultation and visits among missionaries are good to develop communion among us and to improve our ministry better and witnessing. Beware of stereotypes that could result in avoidance of others.
- 19) Conduct general assembly of the parish annually and parish council meetings as required so as to consult with

them the different aspects of parish life. It will improve people's participation in parish activities still better. Winning the confidence of the parishioners is important to develop 'we' feeling among them. We shall not forget that we live in an era of Synodality.

- 20) Teach our people the modern techniques of farming and animal husbandry, and guide them to obtain facilities for the same within their reach. It is good to create an awareness among our people with regard to the importance of natural farming and the need of protecting the nature by preserving the sanctity of the environment.
- 21) Make our people aware of the opportunities for government jobs, self-employment, loan facilities etc.
- 22) Give our youth and children the orientation for professional courses, like ITI, ITC, Polytechnic etc. Montfort ITI, BPQ, is providing opportunities for various courses and grant scholarships to deserving students.
- 23) Help our youth in the best way possible to get married to partners of our faith. It is highly encouraged to arrange meetings of marriageable youth in parish/Zone/diocese levels (*Vadhu-Vara Melava*).
- 24) Keep simplicity in life-style, food habits, conveyance etc as required. Try to do justice to the land attached to our institution with its optimum use by cultivation and otherwise. Keep our campus clean, green and nature-friendly.
- 25) Encourage our people to involve in politics to participate in political fray, to enroll names in votes' list and to act with objective political morality.

DECREE ON THE GRANTING OF THE INDULGENCE DURING THE ORDINARY JUBILEE YEAR 2025 CALLED BY HIS HOLINESS POPE FRANCIS

"Now the time has come for a new Jubilee, when once more the Holy Door will be flung open to invite everyone to an intense experience of the love of God" (Spes non confundit, 6). In the Bull announcing the Ordinary Jubilee of 2025, at a moment in history in which "heedless of the horrors of the past, humanity is confronting yet another ordeal, as many peoples are prey to brutality and violence" (Spes non confundit, 8), the Holy Father calls on all Christians to become *pilgrims of hope*. This is a virtue which must be sourced above all in the grace of God and in the fullness of His mercy. It is to be rediscovered in the signs of the times, which, encompassing "the yearning of human hearts in need of God's saving presence, ought to become signs of hope" (Spes non confundit, 7).

Previously, in the Bull announcing the Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy in 2015, Pope Francis underlined how the Indulgence acquired "an even more important meaning" in that context (Misericordiae vultus, 22), since God's mercy becomes the "indulgence on the part of the Father who, through the Bride of Christ, his Church, reaches the pardoned sinner and frees him or her from every residue left by the consequences of sin" (ibid.). Similarly, now the Holy Father declares that the gift of the Indulgence "is a way of discovering the unlimited nature of God's mercy. Not by chance, for the ancients, the terms 'mercy' and 'indulgence' were interchangeable, as expressions of the fullness of God's forgiveness, which knows no bounds" (Spes non confundit, 23). The Indulgence, therefore, is a Jubilee grace.

And so, also during the Ordinary Jubilee of 2025, by will of the Supreme Pontiff, this 'Court of Mercy', which is responsible for all that concerns the granting and use of indulgences, wishing to encourage the souls of the faithful and nourish the pious desire to obtain the Indulgence seen as a gift of grace specific to each Holy Year, establishes the

following indications, so that the faithful may take advantage of the "norms for obtaining and rendering spiritually fruitful the practice of the Jubilee indulgence" (Spes non confundit, 23).

During the Ordinary Jubilee of 2025, all others Indulgences previously granted remain in force. All the faithful, who are truly repentant and free from any affection for sin (cf. *Enchiridion Indulgentiarum*, IV ed., norm. 20, § 1), who are moved by a spirit of charity and who, during the Holy Year, purified through the sacrament of penance and refreshed by Holy Communion, pray for the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff, will be able to obtainfrom the treasury of the Church a plenary indulgence, with remission and forgiveness of all their sins, which can be applied in suffrage to the souls in Purgatory in the following ways:

I.-Pilgrimages

The faithful, *pilgrims of hope*, will be able to obtain the Jubilee Indulgence granted by the Holy Father if they undertake a pious pilgrimage:

to any sacred Jubilee site: by devoutly participating in Holy Mass (where the liturgical norms allow for it, the Mass of the Jubilee might fruitfully be chosen, or one of the Votive Masses: for Reconciliation, for the Remission of Sins, for the Promotion of Charity or to Foster Harmony); a ritual Mass for the conferral of the sacraments of Christian Initiation or the Anointing of the Sick; or any of the following: a celebration of the Word of God; the Liturgy of the Hours (office of readings, lauds, vespers); the Via Crucis; the Marian Rosary; the recitation of the Akathist hymn; a penitential celebration, which ends with the individual confessions of the penitents, as established in the Rite of Penance (form II);

in Rome: by visiting at least one of the four Major Papal Basilicas: St. Peter's in the Vatican, the Archbasilica of the Holy Saviour (St John Lateran's), Saint Mary Major's, and St. Paul's Outside the Walls;

in the Holy Land: by visiting at least one of the three basilicas: the Basilica of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem, the Basilica of the Nativity in Bethlehem, or the Basilica of the Annunciation in Nazareth;

in other ecclesiastical areas: by visiting the Cathedral or other church or sacred place designated by the local Ordinary. Bishops will take into account the needs of the faithful as well as the opportunity to reinforce the concept of pilgrimage with all its symbolic significance, so as to manifest the great need for conversion and reconciliation;

II.-Pious visits to sacred places

Likewise, the faithful can obtain the Jubilee Indulgence if, individually or in a group, they devoutly visit any Jubilee site and there, for a suitable period of time, engage in Eucharistic adoration and meditation, concluding with the Our Father, the Profession of Faith in any legitimate form, and invocations to Mary, the Mother of God, so that in this Holy Year everyone "will come to know the closeness of Mary, the most affectionate of mothers, who never abandons her children" (Spes non confundit, 24).

During the Jubilee Year, in addition to the aforementioned places of pilgrimage, the following sacred places may also be visited under the same conditions:

in Rome: the Basilica of the Holy Cross in Jerusalem, the Basilica of St Lawrence at the Verano, the Basilica of St Sebastian, (the traditional visit to "the seven Churches of Rome", so close to the heart of St Philip Neri is also highly recommended), the Sanctuary of Divine Love (the 'Divino Amore'), the Church of the Holy Spirit in Sassia, the Church of St Paul at the Tre Fontane, (the site of the Martyrdom of the Apostle), the Roman Catacombs; the churches of the Jubilee Pathways dedicated respectively to the Iter Europaeum and to the Female Patrons of Europe and Doctors of the Church (the Basilica of Santa Maria sopra Minerva, and the churches of St Brigid at Campo de' Fiori, Santa Maria della Vittoria, Trinità dei Monti, the Basilica of Saint Cecilia in Trastevere, and the Basilica of Sant'Augustine in Campo Marzio);

in other places in the world: the two Minor Papal Basilicas in Assisi – those of St Francis and Our Lady of the Angels; the Pontifical Basilicas of Our Lady of Loreto, Our Lady of Pompeii, and St Anthony in Padua; any minor basilica, cathedral church, co-cathedral church, Marian sanctuary, any distinguished collegiate church or sanctuary designated

by the diocesan bishop or Eparchyfor the benefit of the faithful, and national or international sanctuaries, "sacred places of welcome and privileged spaces for the rebirth of hope" (Spes non confundit, 24), as indicated by Episcopal Conferences.

The faithful who are truly repentant of sin but who cannot participate in the various solemn celebrations, pilgrimages and pious visits for serious reasons (especially cloistered nuns and monks, but also the elderly, the sick, prisoners, and those who, through their work in hospitals or other care facilities, provide continuous service to the sick), can obtain the Jubilee Indulgence, under the same conditions if, united in spirit with the faithful taking part in person, (especially when the words of the Supreme Pontiff or the diocesan Bishop are transmitted through the various means of communication), they recite the Our Father, the Profession of Faith in any approved form, and other prayers in conformity with the objectives of the Holy Year, in their homes or wherever they are confined (e.g. in the chapel of the monastery, hospital, nursing home, prison...) offering up their sufferings or the hardships of their lives;

III.-Works of mercy and penance

In addition, the faithful will be able to obtain the Jubilee Indulgence if, with a devout spirit, they participate in popular missions, spiritual exercises, or formation activities on the documents of the Second Vatican Council and the Catechism of the Catholic Church, held in a church or other suitable place, according to the mind of the Holy Father.

Despite the rule that only one plenary indulgence can be obtained per day (cf. *Enchiridion Indulgentiarum*, IV ed., norm. 18, § 1), the faithful who have carried out an act of charity on behalf of the souls in Purgatory, if they receive Holy Communion a second time that day, can obtain the plenary indulgence twice on the same day, applicable only to the deceased (this must take place within a Eucharistic celebration; see can. 917 and the Pontifical Commission for the authentic interpretation of the CIC, *Responsa ad dubia*, 1, 11 July 1984). Through this double act, a praiseworthy exercise of supernatural charity is carried out, through that bond by which the faithful still journeying on this earth are united in

the mystical Body of Christ, with those who have already completed their journey, by virtue of the fact that "the Jubilee indulgence, thanks to the power of prayer, is intended in a particular way for those who have gone before us, so that they may obtain full mercy" (Spes non confundit, 22).

In a special way "during the Holy Year, we are called to be tangible signs of hope for those of our brothers and sisters who experience hardships of any kind" (Spes non confundit, 10). Therefore, the Indulgence is also linked to certain works of mercy and penance, which bear witness to the conversion undertaken. The faithful, following the example and mandate of Christ, are encouraged to carry out works of charity or mercy more frequently, especially in the service of those brothers and sisters who are burdened by various needs. More especially, they should rediscover these "corporal works of mercy: to feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, clothe the naked, welcome the stranger, heal the sick, visit the imprisoned, and bury the dead " (Misericordiae vultus, 15) and rediscover also "the spiritual works of mercy: to counsel the doubtful, instruct the ignorant, admonish sinners, comfort the afflicted, forgive offences, bear patiently those who do us ill, and pray for the living and the dead" (ibid.).

In this way, the faithful will be able to obtain the Jubilee Indulgence if they visit, for an appropriate amount of time, their brothers and sisters who are in need or in difficulty (the sick, prisoners, lonely elderly people, disabled people...), in a sense making a pilgrimage to Christ present in them (cf. Mt 25, 34-36) according to the usual spiritual, sacramental and prayer conditions. The faithful can repeat these visits throughout the Holy Year, even daily, acquiring a plenary indulgence each time.

The Jubilee Plenary Indulgence can also be obtained through initiatives that put into practice, in a concrete and generous way, the spirit of penance which is, in a sense, the soul of the Jubilee. In particular the penitential nature of Friday can be rediscovered through abstaining, in a spirit of penance, at least for one day of the week from futile distractions (real but also virtual distractions, for example, the use of the media and/or social networks), from superfluous consumption (for example by fasting

or practising abstinence according to the general norms of the Church and the indications of the Bishops), as well as by donating a proportionate sum of money to the poor; by supporting works of a religious or social nature, especially in support of the defence and protection of life in all its phases, but also by supporting the quality of life of abandoned children, young people in difficulty, the needy or lonely elderly people, or migrants from various countries "who leave their homelands behind in search of a better life for themselves and for their families" (Spes non confundit, 13); it can also be obtained by dedicating a reasonable portion of one's free time to voluntary activities that are of service to the community or to other similar forms of personal commitment.

All diocesan bishops and eparchs and those who are equivalent to them in law, on the most appropriate day of this jubilee period, on the occasion of the main celebration in the cathedral and in the individual jubilee churches, may impart the *Papal Blessing* with the attached plenary indulgence, obtainable by all the faithful who receive this *Blessing* under the usual conditions.

In order to facilitate access to the sacrament of Penance and the obtaining of divine forgiveness through the 'Power of the Keys', local Ordinaries are invited to grant to the Canons and Priests, who in the Cathedrals and Churches specially designated for the Holy Year, hear the confessions of the faithful, the faculties limited to the internal forum for the faithful of the Eastern Churches covered by can. 728, § 2 of the CCEO, and in the case of a possible reservation, those for can. 727, excluding, clearly, those cases listed in can. 728, § 1; while for the faithful of the Latin Church, the faculties referred to in can. 508, § 1 of the CIC.

In this regard, this Penitentiary urges all priests to offer generous availability and self-dedication to allow the greatest possible opportunity for the faithful to benefit from the means of salvation, by adopting and publishing time slots for confessions, in agreement with parish priests or rectors of neighbouring churches, by making time to be available in the confessional, planning penitential celebrations on a fixed and frequent basis, and also making the widest possible use of retired priests who do not have other defined pastoral roles. Depending on the possibilities,

priests should remember, in accordance with the <u>Motu proprio</u> <u>Misericordia Dei</u>, the pastoral opportunity that also exists in hearing Confessions during the celebration of Holy Mass.

To facilitate the task of confessors, the Apostolic Penitentiary, by mandate of the Holy Father, grants to priests who accompany or join Jubilee pilgrimages outside their own Diocese the right to make use of the same faculties which they have been granted in their own Diocese by the legitimate authority. Special faculties will be conferred by this Apostolic Penitentiary to the penitentiaries of the Papal Basilicas in Rome, and to Canon Penitentiaries or Diocesan Penitentiaries established in individual ecclesiastical circumscriptions.

Confessors, after having lovingly instructed the faithful on the gravity of the sins to which a reservation or censure is attached, should determine, with pastoral charity, appropriate sacramental penances, so as to lead penitents, as far as possible to stable repentance and, depending on the nature of the case, invite them to repair any scandal and damages.

Finally, the Penitentiary warmly invites Bishops, as bearers of the triple *munus* of teaching, guiding, and sanctifying, to explain clearly the provisions and principles proposed here for the sanctification of the faithful, taking account of local circumstances, cultures and traditions. A catechesis appropriate to the socio-cultural characteristics of each people will propose the Gospel and the entirety of the Christian message effectively, rooting more deeply in people's hearts the desire for this unique gift, obtained through the mediation of the Church.

This Decree is valid for the entire Ordinary Jubilee of 2025, notwithstanding any provision to the contrary.



PLEANARY INDULGENCE

In the Catholic Church, a Plenary Indulgence is a special type of indulgence that removes all temporal punishment for sins that have already been forgiven. It can be used to cleanse the soul, draw closer to God, and deepen faith. To obtain a plenary indulgence, a Catholic must: Be in a state of grace, sincerely repent and detest their sins, Go to confession and receive Holy Communion, Pray for the intention of Pope and Fulfill all requirements of the indulgence. Some examples of acts that can earn a Plenary Indulgence include: Visiting a holy place or pilgrim centre/shrine, receiving a Papal Blessing, reciting certain prayers, spending time in a spiritual retreat, completing an evangelizing mission, reading scripture for at least 30 minutes, adoring the Blessed Sacrament for at least 30 minutes, participating in a Eucharistic procession and adoring the Cross at the Good Friday Liturgy. A person can only receive one plenary indulgence per day, unless it is at the hour of death.

The history of plenary indulgences in the Catholic Church can be traced back to the early Christian community's practices of penance. Early Christian communities required the faithful to serve out the punishment for their sins through public actions and procedures. Around 1000-1100 A.D., the Church began to intervene to alleviate or annul the punishment for the faithful. In 1095, Pope Urban II declared at the Council of Clermont that anyone who participated in the Crusades and repented of their sins would receive a plenary indulgence. Later, the Church began to grant indulgences to those who could not participate in the Crusades but contributed money. A plenary indulgence, or "full" indulgence, cancels all existing obligations. A "partial" indulgence only remits a portion of the obligation.

OBSERVANCE OF JUBILEE YEAR IN THE CHURCH

As we go back to the history of observance of Jubilee Year in the Church we learn that it was in the year 1300, Pope Boniface VIII called the first Jubilee, also known as a "Holy Year", since it is a time in which God's holiness transforms us. The frequency of Holy Year has changed over time: at first, they were celebrated every 100 years, later 1343 Pope Clement VI reduced the gap between Jubilee to every 50 years, and in 1470 Pope Paul II made it every 25 years. There have been "extraordinary" Holy Years: for example, in 1933 Pope Pius XI chose to commemorate the 1900th anniversary of the redemption and in 2015 Pope Francis proclaimed the Year of Mercy as an extraordinary Jubilee. The way in which years are marked has also changed through the cultures: originally the Holy Year was consisted of a pilgrimage to the Roman Basilica of St. Peter and St. Paul, later other signs were added, such as the Holy Door, by participating in the Holy Year one is granted a plenary indulgence etc.

The biblical reference to jubilee is connected to Leviticus 25:8-13, wherein we see that a jubilee year was marked every 50 years, since this would be an "extra" year, one which would happen every seven weeks of seven years, i.e. 49 years. Indeed it was considered as an occasion for repentance, and to re-establish a proper relationship with God, with one another and with all creation. It is counted as a time of new and fresh beginning for betterment of a new horizon of relationship and endeavors ahead.

Pope Francis announced that the 2025 Jubilee Year begins on December 24, 2024 (Christmas Eve) and concludes on feast of Epiphany, January 6, 2026. Bringing God's salvation to everyone was for Jesus the greatest joy, his mission, the meaning of his existence. And in every word and deed with which we join with him in the beautiful adventure of giving love, light, and joy multiply not only around us but also within us. Jubilee Year is a time and again another golden opportunity to reinvigorate our mission to the world (Mt. 28:19-20). The amount received from such events and the donations from institutions and individuals may be availed to help out pregnant women and lactating mothers in the diocese. The amount collected shall be submitted to DFO not later than 30 October 2025. It shall be disbursed to the deserving women in December 2025. The LSSS will coordinate the Prolife Sunday programs in the diocese. May I request everyone's kind cooperation and support.

Dear Fathers, Brothers and Sisters,

Thy Kingdom Come! Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ!

The following will be the Travelling Allowance for priests offering Holy Qurbana in the Religious Houses.

- i. They shall be paid a flat rate of Rs. 12/- per every Kilometer (to and fro) they drive for the purpose of offering Holy Ourbana in the institution.
- ii. For those who use public conveyance, please pay them discreetly.
- iii. This does not apply to those places where the institution is in close vicinity and in walking distance or in the same campus.
- iv. The Travelling Allowance does not include Qurbana intention. It shall be given separately.
- v. Everyone is reminded to re-imburse the required amount to the Parish/institution account, if they use the common vehicle or fuel expenses is paid from the general account of the parish or institution.
- vi. Whenever the vehicle is used for personal purposes it is our understanding in the diocese that the concerned is expected to meet the fuel expense personally.

vii. One is entitled to take reasonable fuel expenses from common account if private/personal/another's vehicle is used for any common purpose of the parish/institution.

TRIBUTE TO Sr. Esther Panachikkal SD

Born: 30.09.1942 First Profession: 06.01.1964 Demise: 15.11.2024

"For me to live is Christ and to die is gain" (Phil 1:21).

This was the spirit of our beloved Sr. Esther, to whom we bade an eternal farewell today.

Sr. Esther was born on 30 September 1942 at Njarakkal in Ernakulam-Angamaly Archdiocese, Kerala, as the loving daughter of Mr. Kunjuvareed and Mrs. Kochumariam of the Panachikkal family.

She made her first profession on 6 January 1964 and her perpetual profession in 1969 and early assignments were in Kerala and her missionary zeal led her to Wirur in 1972, marking the beginning of her remarkable mission life. After six years, she returned to the Mother House in Chunangamvely to pursue a Home Science course at Kalamassery. In 1982, she resumed her mission in Chanda Diocese at Lakkadakote and served tirelessly in the Chanda and Adilabad Dioceses in places like Adilabad, Nirmal, Wirur, Lakkadakote, and Wardha. The only exception to this was her service from 2010 to 2014 in Parkal, Diocese of Warangal, and Lakkawaram, Diocese of Eluru.

Sr. Esther's mission was to spread the Gospel and serve the poor and suffering. For over 50 years, Sr. Esther journeyed from village

to village, often on foot or in bullock carts, bringing the Good News and performing acts of compassion. Most of her days were spent in door-to-door evangelization, meeting both the spiritual and material needs of the people.

Sr. Esther faced challenges with unwavering courage. One notable incident occurred in Lakkadakote when she tactfully dealt with Naxalites who came to attack her. She not only offered them tea but also led them to the church, encouraging them to pray before the Blessed Sacrament.

Her thirst for knowledge was remarkable. She frequently participated in exams and literary competitions at the Congregation and diocesan levels, often earning prizes. By staying updated through newspapers and TV news, she raised awareness about social issues and included the suffering in her prayers. Her heart overflowed with love and compassion for those in need.

Even when ill-health limited her physical activities, Sr. Esther's heart continued to beat for the poor. In 2023, as her health deteriorated, she was moved to Ashadham Hospital, Wirur, for better medical care. Despite her pain, she never complained.

When her condition worsened on November 8, 2024, Rev. Fr. Joseph Thachaparampath CMI, the Provincial Superior of Marthoma Province, Chanda, administered the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick.

On November 15, 2024, at 10:30 a.m., her soul peacefully departed this world to be with her Lord. The mortal remains of Sr. Esther was taken to Sevagram after the *Office of the Dead*, led by Rev. Fr. Thomas VC, Director of Divine Vachan Ashram, Ballarshah. On Sunday, November 17, 2024, the body was brought to the Provincial House in Wardha at 6:40 a.m.

Rev. Fr. Robinson, parish priest of St. Antony's Forane Church, Wardha, along with her brother, Rev. Fr. Paul Panachickal SDB, conducted the first part of the funeral rites. The second part of the funeral rites was officiated by Rev. Fr. Joseph Thachaparampath CMI, Provincial Superior of Marthoma Province, Chanda.

The funeral service began at 3:00 p.m and the Holy Qurbana was officiated by Rt. Rev. Bishop Ephrem Nariculam, Bishop of Chanda. Concelebrating the Holy Qurbana were her brother Rev. Fr. Paul Panachickal SDB, Rev.Fr.Robinson Synchalleus of Dioceses of Chanda, Rev. Fr. Pius Pathiyarathukunnel, Provincial of CMI Marymatha vice Province, Hyderabad, Rev. Fr. Joseph Thachaparampath CMI, and 23 other priests from Adilabad and Chanda.

The farewell address given by Rev. Fr. Mathew Nirapel, parish priest of Santhivivas Church, Wirur, was a heartfelt and befitting tribute to Sr.Esther. Sr.Gracelet the Provincial Superior thanked all who were present and associated with her funeral ceremony.
