

The Diocese celebrated its 28th Diocesan Day on Sunday, 10 November 2024, in commemoration of its Foundation Day on 11 November. For the first time, the celebration was held at the parish level, ensuring the participation of the entire faithful. In preparation, chain adoration was conducted in all parishes and convents, fostering spiritual renewal among the faithful. On 10 November, each parish observed the Diocesan Day with the solemn celebration of the Holy Qurbana. The liturgy included a special introduction on the significance of the day, a symbolic offertory procession, and the lighting of

lamps by representatives. Additional prayers were offered during the Karosoosa. Following the Holy Qurbana, public meetings were held in parishes where the Diocesan annual report, prepared by the Chancellor, Fr. Joshy Kulathumkal, was presented in video, audio, or reading format. Cultural performances by students highlighted the theme, "The Role of the Diocese in Fostering Parish Communities and Strengthening the Faith." The celebrations concluded with meals or refreshments provided by each parish.





The second meeting of the seventh Pastoral Council was held at Sangamam on 1 November 2024, beginning at 9:45 AM with a prayer. Mrs. Juliet, the Joint Secretary, welcomed the members, and Mr. Shonic Regan, the Joint Secretary, presented the report of the previous meeting. Rev. Bishop presided over the meeting. The resource person, Mr. Eugin, President of the Legion of Mary of the Diocese of Kottar, addressed the council on "The Role of the Laity in Building up the Local Church—the Diocese." Drawing from Church documents and

the Bible, he emphasized the rights and duties of the laity and the significance of fostering Christian families rooted in sacramental grace. Council members were divided into seven groups focusing on Liturgy, Catechism, Youth Apostolate, Evangelization, Education, Public Welfare, and Family Apostolate. In the afternoon, the groups discussed questions related to the three topics and presented their findings in the common forum, followed by a collective discussion. The meeting concluded at 3:30 PM with a vote of thanks by Mr. John, the Secretary.





The 9th edition of Varnam, an inter-district painting and drawing competition organized by KKSSS, was held on 8 November 2024, in celebration of National and International Children's Day. Students from 35 schools in Kanyakumari district participated in two categories: Drawing (Grades IV-VI) and Painting (Grades VII-X), showcasing remarkable artistic talents.

The event began with an inaugural address by Rev. Fr. Michael Arokiyaswamy SDB, who emphasized the importance of creativity. Rev. Fr. Nelson conducted an enlightening session on the dangers of addiction. The concluding ceremony was graced by Mrs. Jenusha Ajith, President of Mulagumoodu Panchayat, who congratulated the winners and commended the event's positive impact. Prizes and shields were awarded, making the event a celebration of creativity and social awareness.


From Pots to Plates:Kitchen Gardening Made Simple





On 8 November 2024, KKSSS organized a workshop on "Kitchen Garden" at Pilankarai to promote organic food cultivation among women. The session, led by Mrs. Hemalata, an Agriculture Consultant from Nagercoil, highlighted the growing trend of urban kitchen gardening, particularly in apartments using pots. The workshop, attended by 53 participants, offered practical guidance on starting and maintaining vegetable gardens in limited spaces, encouraging sustainable and healthy living.






On 16 November 2024, the priests and religious of the Diocese gathered at Sangamam to express gratitude to Mar George Cardinal Alencherry, Major Archbishop Emeritus of the Syro-Malabar Church, and to extend a warm welcome.


From Foundation to Glory: Christ the King Church's Consecration Day

The Christ the King Church in Paraicode, established on 17 June 1973 by the CMI Fathers with just 26 parishioners, marked a significant milestone with the consecration of its newly constructed church on 16 November 2024. Over the years, the parish community has grown to 73 families with 278 members.

The first church building, constructed on 12 December 1982 under the leadership of Fr. Thomas Kodiyakkarayil CMI, was handed over to the Diocese of Thuckalay on 28 November 2004. The foundation stone for the new church was blessed by Mar George Cardinal Alencherry on 22 July 2018, with Rev. Bishop laying the stone on 19 August 2018.

The consecration ceremony began at 2:30 PM with a solemn liturgical reception for the celebrants. The Major Archbishop Emeritus of the Syro-Malabar Church, Mar George Cardinal Alencherry, consecrated the church in the presence of Rev. Bishop. Before the ceremony, Rev. Bishop blessed the *kodimaram*. The concelebrants included Rev. Fr. Thomas Powathuparampil, Rev. Fr. Joshy Kulathumkal, and Rev. Fr. Antony Elamthottam CMI, Provincial of the Trivandrum CMI Province.





The annual CML Mission Rally was held on 17 November 2024, starting from Holy Trinity Cathedral Church, Thiruthuvapuram, and concluding at Sacred Heart Forane Church, Padanthalumoodu. The rally was flagged off at 2:00 PM by Rev. Fr. Thomas Powathuparampil, the Vicar General. Children from each forane participated in an orderly manner, marching behind their respective banners or flex boards.

The event concluded with a public meeting at Padanthalumoodu, where Mr. Aju Thomas, the Eparchial CML President, hoisted the flag. Mar George Cardinal Alencherry graced the occasion and delivered an inspiring message. Rev. Bishop participated in the rally from start to finish and addressed the missionaries during the meeting.

CML members from all parishes, along with priests, sisters, teachers, and parents, actively participated in the rally. Prizes were awarded for the best plot and the most active participation.

Blessing of Ambur Presbytery and Mission Meet

The Tenkasi Mission meeting was held at Ambur Mission on 25 November 2024, presided over by Rev. Bishop and graced by the presence of Rev. Fr. Thomas Powathuparampil, the Vicar General. The gathering brought together all the priests and religious actively involved in the Tenkasi Mission. The event began at 5:30 PM with the blessing of a rented house at Alwarkurichy near Ambur, now serving as the priest's residence. This marked a significant milestone for the mission. Fr. Thomas Koippuram, who had been residing in a facility provided by the CMC Sisters at Ambur for over a year, transitioned to the newly blessed presbytery. Following the blessing, the missionaries shared updates and experiences of their mission work, fostering a spirit of collaboration and commitment. The meeting concluded with a fellowship meal, leaving the participants inspired and united in their mission endeavors.











On 02 November 2024, the Health Commission organized a special gathering for bedridden patients and their caregivers at the KKSSS campus, Kalluvilai. This meaningful event brought together 16 bedridden patients along with their caregivers, providing them a space for companionship, care, and spiritual support. The gathering was inaugurated by Rev. Bishop, who expressed heartfelt concern for the well-being of the patients and acknowledged the important role of caregivers in supporting those who are ill or unable to care for themselves. The event was designed to offer not just medical care, but emotional and spiritual healing, reinforcing the community's commitment to supporting the most vulnerable members of society. Healing Hands: Free Medical Camp at St. Mary's Mission Church


